Doug Jones receives elite Engineering award

Doug Jones, convener of our popular "Engineering Marvels" course, has been a "Fellow" of the Institution of Engineers, Australia (EA) since 1993 and recently was presented the award of "Honorary Fellow" of The Institution of Engineers, Australia, the highest category of membership of EA. The general citation the award is based on is:

"Honorary Fellows

Eligible recipients are Fellows of The Institution of Engineers Australia or distinguished non-members, have rendered conspicuous service to the profession of engineering, are eminent in engineering or an allied science, or a distinguished person whom the Council

conspicuous service to the Australian people or in recognition of outstanding achievement."

For 17 continuous years Doug served as an elected office bearer of EA including President of Sydney Division in 1994 and 12 years on the National Council of EA, culminating in his election as National President of EA in 2004.

There are only about 166 Hon Fellows in EA (many now deceased), which has a current national membership of about 100,000. Some well known recipients of the award are:

- His Excellency the former Governor General of Australia, Major General Michael Jeffery
